Congenital Syphilis (CS) occurs when a pregnant person who has syphilis passes the infection to their baby during pregnancy or child birth. CS can cause major health problems for your baby.

How common is CS?

From 2016 to 2020, the rate of CS has increased greatly among American Indians and Alaskan Natives (37.7 cases to 190.6 cases per 100,000 live births)





How can CS affect my baby?

CS may cause:

- Miscarriage
- Still birth
- Prematurity (baby born early)
- Low birth weight
- Death shortly after birth

How can I protect my baby?

- Get a syphilis test at your first prenatal visit
- Reduce your risk of getting syphilis before, during, and after pregnancy
